## VICE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This year at Woodlawn we are working on creating a Makerspace in our old computer lab. Last summer all of the computers from the lab were redistributed and most classrooms were given a pod of four computers. As much of the teaching in an early years school is done in small groups this is a much better fit for teaching and learning.

So, what is a Makerspace? A Makerspace is a space in which students are provided with time and materials to tinker, explore, and create. The possibilities for a Makerspace are endless. Some of the ideas that we are looking at including in our Woodlawn Makerspace are a Lego wall, a construction area with lots of cardboard and styrofoam, some technology including a pod of iPads and a green screen, and a space for arts and crafts. # COUNSELLOTZ'S COTENETZ

Woodlawn students, staff and parents continue to examine beliefs about our behaviour. Do we believe in the illusion that we can control others and make them conform? Do we believe it is our responsibility to coerce? Can other people MAKE us happy, angry or sad? Is our behaviour an uncontrollable response to their actions? Or do we accept that we are responsible for our actions no matter what the actions are of others? Do we believe that each individual has the right to free choice providing it is safe and he/she doesn't interfere with others meeting their needs? What kind of person do we want to be when we make a mistake and hurt others?

And what do we believe as teachers and parents about how to teach children to behave?

These are BIG questions because our beliefs drive our thoughts, actions and feelings. Many students at Woodlawn have been thinking about what they believe about how they should treat each other, and thinking about the person they want to be. And, they are also continuing to learn that IT IS OK TO MAKE MISTAKES – it is how we learn! However, when an adult uses guilt and criticism it contributes to defensive behaviours such as excuses, yelling, running away, denying, lying and blaming. Controlling behaviours such as guilt and criticism often PREVENTS a child from examining their own behaviours.

When a child feels emotionally safe, and when given the opportunity to examine their own behaviour, they will be more willing to:

- ★ Think about what it was they wanted/needed
- \* Think if their behaviour helped or hurt them get what they needed/wanted
- \* Figure out a plan to make it right with the person they wronged
- \* Figure out a better way to get what they need

# Let's Keep Warm!!!

As we all know the weather in Manitoba can change from one moment to the next. Please send your children dressed to deal with the elements. Good boots, mittens, and a hat added to ski pants and a parka makes all the difference between a child enjoying the outdoors or tolerating it. Students are encouraged to go out for recess because it is important to get some fresh air during the day. Remember germs, not cold air, cause illness.

Weather and grounds permitting, all students play outdoors until 8:53 in the morning. Our cold weather policy is to keep students inside at recess when the wind chill factor is –30 or greater. Outside recess times will be shortened if the wind chill is between –25 and –29 Celsius.

#### **School Closure Notifications**

When extreme weather or road conditions call for a school closure you will receive a recorded phone call from Superintendent Randy Dueck beginning at 6:45 am. This additional communication effort is to help ensure that all students will be aware of school closures and no students will find themselves in an unsafe situation where they may be facing extreme weather unnecessarily. When school is cancelled due to weather and road conditions there are no staff members at the school. If your phone number has changed since the beginning of the school year please call the office at 204-326-6110 to update your information.

Schools will be closed due to extreme cold when the temperatures in most locations in the division are -35 degree Celsius or colder with -45 degree Celsius or colder wind-chill.
