ARRIVAL/LEAVING TIME

Walking students and those dropped off by parents should arrive at school after 8:30 in the morning. Teacher supervision is provided starting at 8:30. Any students arriving on the playground before 8:30 will not be supervised and responsibility for the student belongs with the parent/guardian. Students are permitted to enter the building when the 8:53 bell rings.

Students are required to leave for home by 4:00 in the afternoon unless prior arrangements have been made. If you must pick your child up for an appointment please do so before or after recess times. It is difficult for recess supervisors to find students on the playground.

Vice Principal's Message

Happy New Year and welcome back! January is always a wonderful and busy month. A lot of teaching and learning will be taking place this month! At Woodlawn we believe in teaching the whole child and we also believe that we teach children first. Teaching literacy, numeracy, and other subjects is a very important part of what we do everyday. As teachers of young children we also believe that we have to help children learn to be problem solvers. The staff at Woodlawn facilitates this through class meetings, direct teaching, role playing, and direct intervention. Students are encouraged to talk to the person they are having a problem with. They have been taught to use a firm voice and to be assertive (not aggressive or submissive) when someone is doing something that they do not like. The students have been taught to seek the help from an adult if they are being physically hurt or if they are unable to solve the problem themselves. It is very important that our students know that the adults are available to them when they need help. However, children should always be encouraged to try to solve a problem first whenever they are able. When young children lack the language necessary to solve problems adults can prompt them by simply giving them the words. Instead of telling a child to use his/her words provide him/her with the actual words they need in a given situation. For example, "I was playing with that toy. I will give it to you when I am done." Teaching our children to be confident and assertive problem solvers will help them be successful in their social relationships as they grow.

Students in grade 4 have been learning that there are 4 components to all behaviour: Thinking, Acting, Physiology (our body) and Feelings. Restitution helps us understand how we can control our behaviour by making an analogy to a car, with each tire representing one component of behaviour. The two front tires represent thinking and acting. We have the most control over them. The back two tires represent our body (tense? breathing fast? hot? calm?) and our feelings. When we learn to pay attention to all 4 tires, we can control our feelings and our body's reaction by choosing our thoughts and actions. The Behaviour Car analogy can help us take control of our situation.

Isn't it empowering to believe that no matter what others do or say, they cannot control what we think, do or feel? Only we can control that!

The main reasons students find winter outdoor recesses too cold is that they do not dress warmly enough or they do not get active enough. At Woodlawn we feel that students benefit from the fresh air, and are able to focus on their work much more effectively if they have had outdoor recess. Parents, please remind your children to bring clothing that will make it possible to have enjoyable outdoor recesses, even on quite cold days.
